We are so glad to be back in Uganda doing all that we can to reach people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Here are some of the many things we have been involved in during the last two months.

We have been able to get a temporary structure put up in the mountain village of Kyishanyarazi. It is a blessing to have our own land and now a temporary building as we build the people.

Before we could start the construction on the permanent building in Kyinyayobyo, we had to repair a drainage ditch that was causing flooding on the property. Now that it is completed, we can begin the work on the church building.

We had a 4-day teaching course in the village of Kajwenge. This is our newest church plant, and we are excited about the work that Bro Chrispo is doing there. Through the generosity of a church in California we were provided with the

funds to get a piece of land where we will be able to construct a permanent building. Praise the Lord.

We finished another term in the Bible college. courses taught this semester were Ministry Preparation and Philippians/Colossians. The students were helped greatly by these two courses of study.

In the church in Kasese town we had our missions conference in December with special speaker Pastor John Bosco from another independent Baptist church in the capital city. He preached some great messages concerning giving of yourself to the Lord. The church promised to give about \$1,250 to missions for the year 2025. That is great considering the average income here is very low.

We were able to help three of our men with motorcycles which will help tremendously in the ministry. Two of the men are pastoring churches in the villages but are still undergoing training. One of the three has graduated from Bible college and is preparing to go to the border town of Bwera to start a church. These motorcycles will be a tremendous blessing.

The police ministry has opened up again. I am able to preach every Monday morning to the regular police assembly and then again at the

regional meeting of all the high ranking officers for the district. Praise the Lord one of the officers has gotten saved! He is the police spokesperson for this district. We have started discipleship, and he is very eager to learn.

We want to thank everyone for their Christmas and New Years greetings, the emails, cards and the many monetary gifts. Thank you all so much!!

We pray that God will use us even more in 2025. We thank you for your faithful prayers and

faithful support. What we were able to accomplish in 2024 was because of you Etc... all. God bless you!!
